



Dear Parents and Guardians,

At Moore County High School, the safety and well-being of our students is always a top priority. As part of our ongoing efforts to promote a safe school and community environment, and in accordance with TCA 49-6-1016, which requires annual firearm training safety instruction to all K-12 students starting in the 2025-26 school year, we will be providing firearm safety instruction to all students in grades 7–12.

This instruction is designed to educate students on essential safety practices and help prevent accidental injuries. The content will include:

- How to safely store a firearm
- School safety guidelines relating to firearms
- How to avoid injury if a student encounters a firearm
- The importance of never touching a found firearm
- The need to immediately notify a trusted adult of the location of a found firearm

This safety instruction will take place during your child's 4th-period class (high school students) or 5th-period class (middle school students) and will be delivered by their classroom teacher.

Please note:

- The instruction will be viewpoint-neutral and will not include any discussion or advocacy related to political topics such as gun rights, gun control, gun violence, or the Second Amendment to the U.S. Constitution.
- There will be no use or presence of live firearms, live ammunition, or live fire during this instruction.

Our goal is to equip students with knowledge that can help prevent accidents and promote responsible behavior around firearms in all settings. If you have any questions about this program, please don't hesitate to contact the school office.
