GRADUATING WITH STATE DISTINCTION

Attaining a B or better average and completing one (1) of the following:

- (a) Earn a national and/or state-recognized industry certification;
- (b) Participate in at least one (1) of the Governor's Schools;
- (c) Participate in one (1) of the state's All-State musical organizations;
- (d) Earn statewide recognition or award at a skill- or knowledge-based state tournament, convention, or competition hosted by a statewide student organization, and/or qualify for national recognition by a national student organization;
- (e) Be selected as a National Merit Finalist or Semifinalist;
- (f) Attain a composite score of 31 or higher on the ACT or SAT equivalent;
- (g) Attain a score of three (3) or higher on at least two advanced placement exams;
- (h) Successfully complete the International Baccalaureate Diploma Programme; or earn 12 or more semester hours of postsecondary credit.

MILITARY ENLISTMENT

Enlisted in a branch of military service and will report to duty after graduation.

NATIONAL HONOR SOCIETY

Seniors are required to maintain an average of 95, complete at least 15 hours of volunteer service per year, and pay dues.

TRI-STAR GRADUATE

Earns a composite score of nineteen (19) or higher on the ACT, or an equivalent score on the SAT, and earns a capstone industry certification as promoted by the Department of Education, shall be recognized as a Tennessee Tri-Star Scholar upon graduation from high school.

ACADEMIC WALL OF FAME

Earned a 30+ on the ACT, a perfect sub-score on at least one section of the ACT, a national award, acceptance into an Ivy League college, or a college with under a 10% acceptance rate, a perfect score of 5 on an AP test.

Feb. 14, 2018 – A shooting at Marjory Stoneman Douglas High School in Parkland, Fla., is one of the deadliest school massacres with 17 fatalities and 17 injuries.

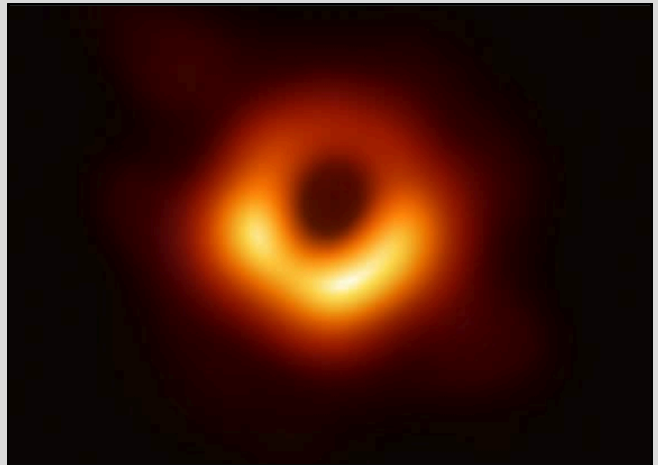

Aug. 2, 2018 – Apple Inc. becomes the world's first public company to achieve a market capitalization of \$1 trillion.

Oct. 10, 2018 – Hurricane Michael makes landfall at Mexico Beach, Fla., as a Category 5 hurricane with winds of 160 mph and a minimum pressure of 919 mb. It is the most intense hurricane to hit the mainland U.S. since Camille in 1969.

• **April 10, 2019** – Scientists from the Event Horizon Telescope project announce the first image of a black hole, located in the centre of the M87 galaxy.

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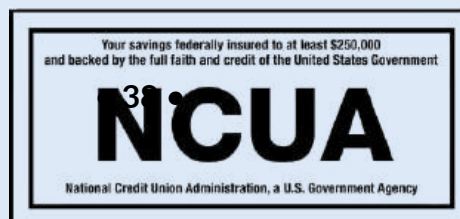

May 30, 2024 – Former President Donald Trump is found guilty on 34 felony counts in his hush money trial, the first time any American president had been found guilty of a crime.

- March 25, 2026 – Mark Zuckerberg's Meta and YouTube (owned by Alphabet Inc., Google's parent company) are found liable for social media addiction in a landmark court case.
- April 1, 2026 – Artemis II astronauts launch a 10-day mission, heading for lunar space for the first time since Apollo 17 in December 1972.

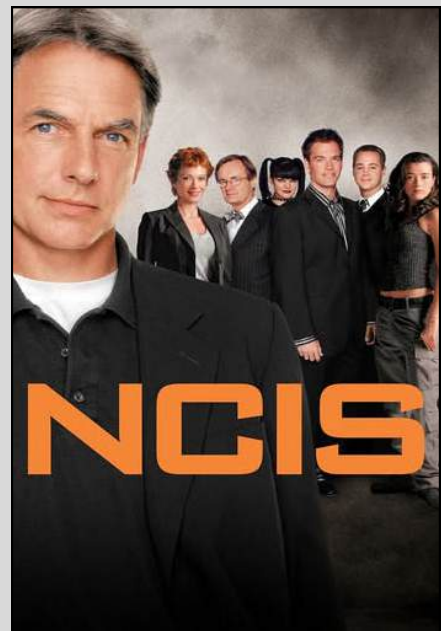
- 2015 – Star Wars: The Force Awakens rewrote the record book. It crossed \$1 billion worldwide and helped push the U.S. box office past \$11 billion for the first time.
- 2017 – The summer box office hit its worst slump in over a decade. Revenue fell to about \$3.8B, with underperforming sequels and big-budget misses driving the gloom.
- 2020 – The pandemic cratered theatrical exhibition. North American box office fell about 80% – an unprecedented collapse year.
- 2023 – “Barbenheimer” turned the box office into a cultural event again. Barbie and Oppenheimer delivered a historic shared opening weekend.

HEADLINES

- 2014 – HBO and CBS announced standalone streaming products, a major signal that premium TV was moving beyond the traditional pay-TV bundle.
- 2016 – Netflix went global. The service launched in more than 130 additional countries, turning streaming into a truly worldwide TV business.
- 2019 – The streaming wars officially arrived. Disney+ and Apple TV+ launched as major new challengers to Netflix, with more services crowding into the market.
- 2025 – Nielsen said streaming accounted for 44.8% of TV viewing in May 2025, edging past broadcast and cable together for the first time.
